Weekend 24-26 September **St Thérèse of Lisieux Retreat** - led by Dr Denise Clare Oliver
-The Saint who did ordinary things extraordinarily well -

The way of St Thérèse is accessible to everyone who wants to grow in their love of God. St Thérèse had very few extraordinary experiences, one of the things which make her little way so accessible & attractive - a way of love which all can follow, it is the key to understanding the universal call to holiness, available to all the baptized who can reach the heights of holiness by responding to God's grace in ordinary daily tasks. This retreat will focus on St Thérèse's little way, her prayer and her deep penetration of the Scriptures, showing how we can imitate her.

(Dr Denise Clare Oliver has taught spiritual theology in Rome and at the School of the Annunciation; she writes and lectures in spirituality in the UK, USA, Rome & Ireland)

Midweek 5-8 October **Lectio Divina Retreat** – led by Gervase Holdaway OSB

Experience the ancient art of praying with Scripture. Once practiced by all Christians, it is the slow, contemplative prayer which enables us to listen to God speaking through his Word and respond prayerfully. The retreat will allow time for solitude, reflection & sharing.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE TIMES

- Please arrive at reception 4pm – 5.30pm on the first day of the retreat, and depart after lunch on the last day; except at the midday Lectio Divina retreat which finishes after breakfast.

- The first session or conference is usually after Compline on the first evening ie. at about 8.30pm.

TRAVEL

Douai Abbey is a mile north of the A4 at Woolhampton, halfway between Reading & Newbury.

- **By road:** to Douai Abbey, Upper Woolhampton, Reading RG7 5TQ
- **By train:** alight at Midgham, served from London, Paddington, Reading & Newbury.
- **By Bus** The local bus is No 1 (Reading – Newbury) alight at Woolhampton (The Angel Pub).
- **By National Express:** buses now arrive off Junction 11 of the M4; there take a bus to Reading station for a train or bus onwards.

There is an affordable **taxi service** to bring guests up the hill from Woolhampton or Midgham Station (1½ miles), but it is best to phone and book in advance.
